Why do a Master of Education degree?

- To enhance personal development through reflective practice
- To advance professional development and improve skills and competencies
- To support appraisal, performance management and promotion prospects
- To develop leadership and management skills

Please note that this does not give Qualified Teacher Status.

What does it involve?

A flexible modular approach is offered, including face to face taught modules and online teaching. Usually students will take modules to the value of 60 credit points per year. The table below shows the various levels of award that are offered based on the number of credit points achieved. See "How do I progress through the course?" for more detail.

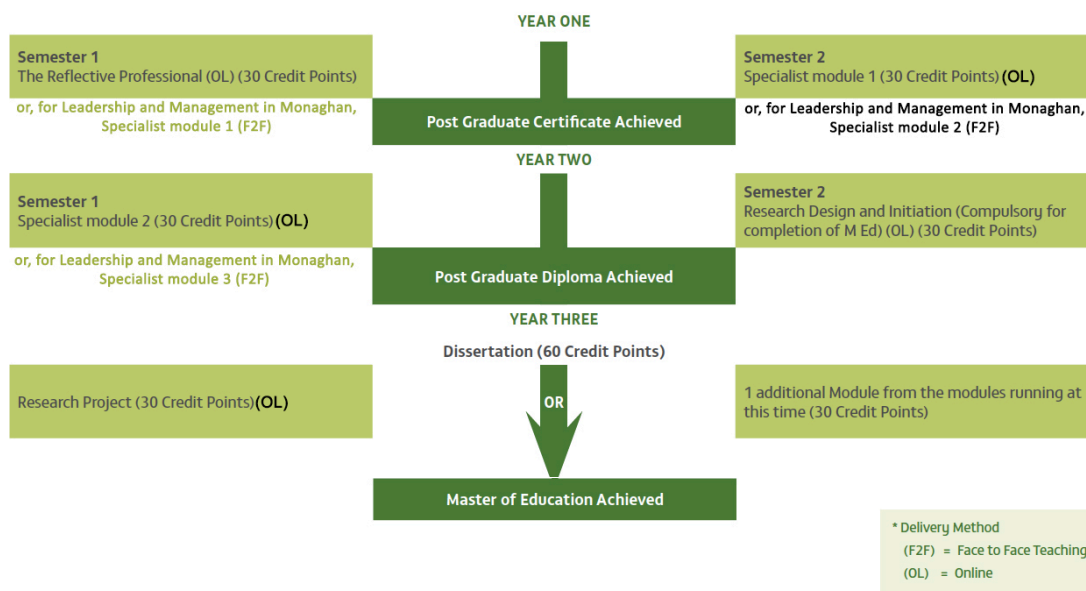

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How do I progress through the Course?

Students will take three 10 credit modules from the menu of four below, plus one 30 credit module as follows:



Entry requirements

Applicants must possess an Undergraduate Honours Degree or equivalent plus current experience in the field of education/ training.

How much will it cost?

The 2017/18 fee per credit point module is likely to be in the region of £880 (for Home and EU Students) and participants will normally complete 60 credit points per year.
